- Prepares prior to the game, offers feedback at half-time (where applicable), and coaches and reflects with the referee team after the game

- Takes notes during the game that highlight positive behavior and notes areas of improvement for the referee team
- Leads the referee team in the reflection session after the game
- Writes the evaluation of the referee team performance
- Takes ownership of self-development through on-line and field session opportunities offered by the competition, State Referee Programs, and/or U.S. Soccer
- Prepares prior to an education session to deliver the best experience for match officials and/or Referee Mentors
- Reflects after each task of the National Referee Coach to develop a plan for selfimprovement
